Labor's tax cuts to benefit Hotham

We're delivering a tax cut for every taxpayer in Hotham starting on 1 July. That's around 86,000 who will receive a tax break. The average tax cut will be \$1,411.



Creating more jobs

New analysis shows that an average of more than 1,000 jobs have been created each day under the Albanese Government - the highest daily average on record for an Australian government.



Cheaper medicines

We've made another 94 medicines available as 60-day prescriptions. This means you can pick up two months of eligible medicines for the cost of one.



Expanding Paid Parental Leave

Paid Parental Leave will increase from 20 to 26 weeks by 2026 - a full six months - with the first increase starting from 1 July this year. This is on top of Federal's Labor's plan to pay superannuation on Paid Parental Leave from 1 July 2025.
